Project Management and Engineering

1 [Hillside Drainage Improvements](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - Substantial drainage analysis and inventory has been completed on the Hillside. Annual state grant funding is proposed to begin implementing solutions for the prioritized problem areas.

2 [Little Campbell Creek Basin Improvements](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - The project has not started. Annual state grant funding is proposed.

3 [Hillside LRSAs Road and Drainage System Rehab](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - State grant funding is proposed annually in the approved CIP to supplement local mill levies.

4 [Elmore Rd Extension - Abbott Rd to OMalley Rd](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - Funding is proposed as a funding partnership of state grants and local road bonds.

5 [Huffman Rd Extension - Birch Rd to Hillside Dr](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. This project will remain on the Capital Project Needs List for future funding consideration. The road is identified as a collector in the Official Streets and Highways Plan.

1 [DeArmoun Rd Upgrade Ph II - 140th Ave to Hillside Dr](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - Environmental and design work was completed by the State of Alaska. However, the project is being re-evaluated in light of public comment and future funding is uncertain. This is a state owned facility.

2 [OMalley Elementary Safety Trail Crossing at OMalley Rd](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - Design efforts by the State of Alaska for an upgrade to OMalley Road have been funded and trail construction is anticipated as part of that project. This is a state-owned facility and evaluation and funding would be by the State of Alaska.

3 [Birch Rd Upgrade - OMalley Rd to Huffman Rd](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - No work is underway. This is a state owned facility and prioritization and funding would be through the State of Alaska.

4 [OMalley Rd Trail - Seward Hwy to Hillside Dr](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - Design efforts by the State of Alaska for an upgrade to OMalley Road have been funded and trail construction is anticipated as part of that project. This is a state-owned facility and evaluation and funding would be by the State of Alaska.

5 [Abbott Rd Upgrade - Lake Otis Pkwy to Birch Rd](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - Reconnaissance study efforts by the State of Alaska are underway. This is a state owned facility and evaluation and future funding would be through the State of Alaska. The road is designated as a minor arterial in the Official Streets and Highways Plan (OS&HP).

6 [OMalley Rd Upgrade - Seward Hwy to Hillside Dr](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - Phase 1 construction is anticipated to begin in 2016. Design efforts by the State of Alaska for an upgrade to OMalley Road are underway. Right of way funding has been requested through a state grant. This route is designated as a minor arterial in the Official Streets and Highways Plan (OS&HP).

7 [Abbott Rd/Hillside Dr Trail - Rabbit Creek Rd to Seward Hwy](#)

Status: Apr 13 2015 - No work is underway. The project will remain on the Capital Project Needs List for evaluation and future funding consideration. Both Abbott Road and Hillside Drive are state owned facilities and funding would be from state or federal sources.

Status: Apr 13 2015 - Park Maintenance performs monthly safety inspections and repairs the park assets as necessary.
